1271. CONSTANZE MOZART¹ TO BREITKOPF & HÄRTEL,² LEIPZIG

Vienna / To / Messrs. Breitkopf & Härtel, / Leipzig

Most highly honoured sirs,

Vienna, 14th Dec., 1799

Since I could very comfortably have had an answer to my letter of 27th Nov. today, but did not receive anything, [5] I take this as unambiguous evidence that you persist on rejecting my suggestions. At the same time, I inform you today for the last time,³ although unnecessarily – from this you can once again see the most incontrovertible expression of my consistent wish to remain in contact with you – that at the end of this year I shall most definitely sell my entire stock of my husband's works, [10] and that, as I have already informed you, you are thus placing yourself in the position of being unable to draw any more benefit from it, unless you have a change of mind, along the lines I suggested, before this happens. A fortnight today, on the 28th, I can have your answer to the present letter. If I receive no answer complying with the wish which I have now expressed to you several times, or no answer at all, [15] the present letter is the last with which I shall trouble you, with the exception of those referring to originals⁴ etc. which you are holding to my account and to money which you are holding for me to my account. The latter has grown to a definite debt of 5 fl. 52kr due to my letter of 30th Nov., which cost 12kr, the undetermined debt is indicated at the end of my letter of 20th Nov.⁶ [20] I beseech you to send me the pieces in the first category as soon as possible, asking you to consult the appendix to the letter of 30th Nov. just mentioned.

I have no fears that this letter may be unwelcome or offensive to you, and am confident that you will recognise in it anew the sentiments with which [25] I commend myself to your friendly inclination and with which I have the honour to be,
